This has more than doubled the events that Juniors can play in and accumulate points throughout the season. The demand for beach volleyball in Florida is at its highest and with your help Florida has become the leader in Juniors beach volleyball!

LETTER FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

May was a very exciting month for the Florida Region. **We achieved our goal of having 10,000 members!** After reaching this milestone, we are now the 9th largest region of the 40 regions in our USA Volleyball family.

A few other notable events took place in May that are certainly worth mentioning here:

- On May 1st we announced the joining of several Florida beach tour stops to create the largest USAV sanctioned beach tour in the US. By combining the efforts of our current USAV Dig the Beach tour (**Chris Colgan**) with SSOVA (**Sam Cibrone**) and FBVT (**Gino Ferraro**), we are now able to offer 26 USAV sanctioned tour stops this year. The beach is officially OPEN!
- On May 6th we held our 10th Annual Regional Awards Ceremony in Orlando. At the awards ceremony we celebrated the outstanding volleyball people in Florida that make our Region great. We recognized our Team Florida HP All-Star coaches & our newest Jr. National & National officials, presented over 30 awards, awarded \$4,500 in scholarships to high school seniors, celebrated many club anniversaries, and inducted the newest member to our Florida Region Hall of Fame. Our 14th member to be inducted was **Dr. Cecile Reynaud** of Florida State University.
- On May 7th-8th we hosted our 2011 Girls Jr. Regional Volleyball Championships and crowned award winners in nine age divisions (10U-18U). This year's event played host to 359 teams and took place on 50 courts at the Orange County Convention Center. With 11 vendors in the venue and lots of space throughout the hall, the atmosphere was filled with fun and excitement for everyone.
- On May 21st-22nd we officially kicked off the beach season with our first USAV Dig the Beach Legacy tour stop in Siesta Key. Our first tour stop had almost 400 adult and junior teams in attendance and we anticipate that we will set some new beach attendance records this season.
- On May 21st-22nd we also held our first annual Regional HP Development Camp in Winter Springs. Eight athletes were selected from this camp to attend the upcoming Team Florida HP Travel Team Selection Camp at the University of Tampa in June.
- During May 23rd-27th, Florida Region representatives attended the annual USA Volleyball meetings in Dallas, TX. While at the meetings, we were asked to present to the other 39 Regional Volleyball Associations during the best practices sessions. Our topics were Club Certification and Marketing and our presentations were well received by all in attendance. Additionally, we presented on Growing the Game as a representative for the Regional Volleyball Associations during the 3rd Annual USA Volleyball Congress alongside some very notable presenters from across the US.

You can be very proud to be a member of the Florida Region. We are consistently noted for being a forward thinking Region and we are currently touted as the #1 jr. beach volleyball Region in the US. THANK YOU to all of you for helping us make the Florida Region shine!

CLUB HIGHLIGHT – TAMPA BAY JUNIORS VOLLEYBALL CLUB

Each month a member club is featured in *Vol-eNews*. This is a great way to get to know the Club Director(s) and learn more about the clubs throughout Florida. This month **Lauri Dagostino** and **Tampa Bay Juniors Volleyball Club** will be highlighted.

Q: When did you first get involved with volleyball?

A: My first exposure to volleyball was in 8th grade when I found volleyball by accident. I tried out for the cheerleading squad at McLane Junior High and pulled a hamstring doing a gymnastics move during my final routine – best thing that ever happened to me. Volleyball tryouts were the next thing in line after I recovered. I had fabulous coaches (Mr. & Mrs Goo) who had played with the national team program in Guam. I think we were the only junior high team in Florida doing “over hand” serves in 1975 – how archaic in today’s terms. From there, it was a high school team then college and then starting a club. Randy, my husband, was taking a PE majors course (Volleyball 101) in college at the University of Illinois in 1973. Members of his class were eventually asked to scrimmage against the schools women’s volleyball team to help them get better. He later helped occasionally with teams at high schools he worked at but really never got involved seriously until he came to Tampa as the Athletic Director at Tampa Prep in 1976-77 school year. Then of course, the real story began at Berkeley in the 1981-82 school year.

Q: You and your husband, Randy, were instrumental in establishing the High Performance (HP) Program in Florida. Tell us about the progress you have seen in the HP Program since it first began.

A: We were one of the first USAV regions to see the value of and start an HP program. Since then, the program has been competitive every year at the HP Championships helping Florida to earn a lot of national respect for being a volleyball hotbed. The number of players in the program has grown, the organization to run the program has become solid, the level of play has continued to increase, more coaches are getting involved and all of this just helps the sport continue to be the fastest growing sport for girls in the country. And even though boy’s volleyball is not the mainstream in Florida yet, the boys program has grown and is becoming strong as well.

Q: Congratulations on being awarded the “Ernest Langford Pioneer Award” at the 2011 Florida Region Awards Ceremony! How has volleyball impacted you and your family?



A: For me, volleyball has become a way of life I never imagined. It's now a family thing we do, not just a part time job. It's a passion that has brought my family so many gifts of which many do not get to experience. It has created special bonds between my kids and their coach/father that are hard to replace. It has given me a chance to be with my kids as they grew in a way that a 9-5 job would not. It has offered Randy and I a chance to share our lives in business through the development of a club program, where we were intimately woven into the lives of many kids along the way and lastly in the excitement of running a large tournament together. All of which are priceless.

Q: Tell us about your family. What key volleyball accomplishments for each of your kids are you most proud of?

A: I guess I am just proud of the fact that they have found their passion – well, at least one of their passions in life. Randy and I were very careful to expose them to every sport and not choose for them. They both truly enjoy playing and I think anyone can see that when they watch them. I LOVE watching them play with all of the pure joy, excitement and competitive qualities they exhibit. They have a way of making everyone on their teams “want” to play as well – that is an intangible gift. The other stuff – Awards, National High Performance teams, and college scholarships – those are just icing on the cake.

Q: As the first USAV Club established in Florida, what have you done to continue your success as a club?

A: Running a club is more than just teaching a sport. It is managing people, influencing lives, being creative with your programming and customer service. I think you need to know what it is you want to be and plan accordingly.

We never tried to be the club we weren't. We knew we didn't have the right infrastructure to be a mega-club so we never tried to service a huge clientele. We just focused on being the best we could be at the size that fit. We tried to find other coaches who shared a passion for the sport, mentor new ones and just support the growth of volleyball in general. We helped many new clubs start up and that in turn helped us become better.

We decided that putting our teams in the most competitive situations – even though they may lose – was the best was to become better. So we traveled to play the best teams we could, played out of age division and fostered the most game like, competitive practices we could.

Also, Randy is all about learning and finds those pearls of coaching wisdom in the strangest places. That's the passion that drove us for all these years – his love of teaching – and that's how he views coaching... it's teaching.



Q: How many teams were in your first year? How many now?

A: We have had the perfect “bell curve” of club volleyball. In 1984 we had one team. The largest number we had was probably in the late 90’s and that was 18. We now have 2 girl’s teams and 1 boy’s team and it is blissfully manageable.

Q: If you could brag about your club, what would you say?

A: Two things..... One, we have been able to compete with the best teams in the country in any given year without practicing 4-5 times a week. We don’t start our practices until January, we don’t run summer camps and we allow kids to be multi-sport athletes or have other passions outside of sports if they want to. But somehow, we manage to keep teams nationally competitive. And two, through this sport we have been able to help so many girls get to a college of their dreams. Many of which would not have had the opportunity to do so either because of financial limitations of the family or because of how tough it is to get into many universities.

Q: What are some of your goals for your club?

A: We have reached them really. It’s been the same every year – to be the best we can be and that means teaching each athlete how to be the best player and teammate they can be with what they have. Everyone wants to win right?

Q: Tell us about the transition of moving the Big South National Qualifier from Tampa, FL, to Atlanta, GA?

A: If anyone remembers the last year we were here in Florida they will recall the 11th hour announcement to have ½ of the event in Orlando. We received a lot of nasty emails over that one. But it was a choice of turning away tons of teams or moving facilities – we lost the use of USF at the last minute. While that worked as a short-term solution, it wasn’t the best scenario for anyone. Tampa was just too small so we needed find a new home. We sent out an RFP and it came down to either Orlando or Atlanta. We would have loved to keep it in the state, but Atlanta won out in the end. Looking back it has been a good move. We have been able to have a huge effect on the growth of club volleyball in Georgia, Alabama and other surrounding states much as we did here in Florida. It also allowed the event to attract more diverse teams because Atlanta’s airport had many more flight schedules to accommodate the in and out time issues teams have when trying to travel to another time zone. And that diversity has helped every team that attends the event become a better team. The tournament has become one of the most competitive qualifying events to attend.



Q: What do you look forward to in the future for the Florida Region?

A: Its second life..... the Florida Region should always want to be the leader it has been; to be progressive and on the cutting edge nationally; be a rebel.

When Randy & I first got involved with the region there were no junior people involved, no junior structure. It was the passion, drive and creativity of a few young coaches across the state that crafted what we have today. While that sort of pioneering may not be needed anymore to **start** the wheels rolling, it is needed to continue into the next best phase.

They say the death of a business begins when you lack the vision to see what improvements you can/should make. Volleyball has come full circle in many ways. Now is a great time to take a step at reinventing the Florida Region and have the vision that no other USAV region or the even the national USAV structure has had.
