FLORIDA SET TO HOST THE 2019 AVCA SMALL COLLEGE BEACH CHAMPIONSHIPS!

The American Volleyball Coaches Association has selected Hickory Point Beach as the host site of the 2019 Small College Beach Championships!

Eustis, FL – January 8, 2019 – The American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) has selected Hickory Point Beach Sand Volleyball Complex in Tavares, FL to host the 2019 AVCA Small College Beach Championships. The event will be held on April 19-21, 2019. Admission is free and spectators are encouraged to attend!

Beach Volleyball is the NCAA's fastest growing sport, starting with 15 Division 1 programs in 2012 and projected to top 100 collegiate programs by 2020. Throughout its history, the AVCA has filled the need for events while the sport grows towards championship status. From 2012-2015, the AVCA hosted the Collegiate Beach Volleyball National Championships in Gulf Shores, AL until, after just four seasons, beach volleyball reached the 40-program threshold needed for NCAA championship status.

In 2018, Hickory Point Beach hosted the inaugural AVCA Small College Beach Championships where there were 14 different schools. The event drew in an estimated 500 attendees (athletes and spectators). This year, the 2nd Annual Small College Beach Championships will host divisions for DII, DIII, NAIA and Two Year Colleges. The AVCA expects there to be 20 schools competing in the Championships including St. Leo University, University of Tampa and Florida Southern College, making this collegiate beach event the largest team event in the United States.

Hickory Point Beach is a 21-court state-of-the-art sand volleyball complex in Central Florida that currently hosts many USAV, high school, and collegiate beach events annually. The local county government is currently in the process of constructing a new building to support beach volleyball events, which will open on February 23, 2019. The new 4,000 sf support building will have showers, locker rooms, along with a medical room for participating teams and athletes. Additionally, it will have public restrooms, a concession area, a VIP area, an official's locker room, a viewing deck and multi-purpose meeting space.

"We're thrilled to return to Hickory Point Beach for our 2nd AVCA Small College Beach Championships," said AVCA Executive Director, **Kathy DeBoer**. "The 21-court facility and pavilion are ideal for a 'celebration-of-beach-volleyball' event, the addition of the new clubhouse is a game-changer in terms of accommodations, and the Florida Region is the best in the business."

The announcement of Hickory Point Beach being selected as the host venue goes along with the recent partnership agreement the AVCA made with the Florida Region of USA Volleyball. The partnership is designed to link college and youth volleyball by providing the region with information on colleges in the area, familiarizing junior athletes with recruiting rules and providing opportunities for engagement and recognition. Hosting the Small College Beach Championship is a great way to connect the AVCA with the Florida Region of USA Volleyball and the junior athletes in the local area.
