CLUB HIGHLIGHT - OCALA POWER VOLLEYBALL ACADEMY

Each month a member club is featured in **Vol-eNews**. This is a great way to get to know the Club Director(s) and learn more about the clubs throughout Florida. This month **Jason Morris** and **Ocala Power Volleyball Academy** will be highlighted.

Q: Tell us how you got started playing volleyball.

A: Began playing volleyball 10 years ago while in the police academy.

Q: How long have you been coaching volleyball?

A: I began coaching volleyball 6 years ago with the brick city volleyball club.

Q: What are all the job titles you currently hold? How do you manage all of those responsibilities?

A: I am currently the director of the Ocala Power volleyball academy as well as the head coach of the Vanguard volleyball program. I can't begin to explain how much of my job relies on the help of others. At Ocala Power and Vanguard High School I have an amazing group of volunteers and an awesome board. The success of the club and school is not the result of ant one person but a group of people working towards a common goal.

Q: What do you like to do in your spare time?

A: In my spare time I love to workout, spend time with my family and hang out with my friends.

Q: Does Ocala Power have a beach volleyball program? Why or why not? Q: Does your club do anything to promote youth volleyball (11 and under)?

A: We have girls as young as 7 participating in camps and our club season. Two years ago we had a 12 year old two woman team qualify for nationals in beach volleyball. We as a club are working hard to provide the young ladies in this town the highest level of coaching and every avenue possible to play in college.

Q: How many of your club kids have gone to play college volleyball? What colleges?

A: In just 3 years of starting this club we have helped approximately 20 girls reach their goal of playing in college. We have girls playing at the University of Miami, Middlebury College in Vermont. Central Florida College, Rollins, Stetson, Florida gulf coast, university of Tampa, Florida Atlantic University and a former high school player of mine is playing at the University of Florida. I think this is what makes us the most successful club in Ocala hands down. It's a great family environment and we as an organization work hard to provide the girls in Ocala an opportunity to play at the next level.







Q: What would you consider to be your club's biggest accomplishments in volleyball?

A: Well we have qualified 3 teams for USAV nationals in 3 years and are the only club in the history of Marion County to do so. This year our 17 s team had a 3rd place finish at AAU nationals and our 15s team won AAU nationals and finished 5th at USAV nationals. We also have already began having girls on our 17s team begin making verbal commitments to colleges.

Q: If you could brag about your club, what would you say?

A: We have a new facility which holds three courts and again I have to attribute this to the hard work of the coaches, parents, players, board members and volunteers.

Q: What do you look forward to in the future for the Florida Region?

A: I look forward to the continued growth of this sport in our region.

OLYMPIC HIGHLIGHTS

• The U.S. women's beach volleyball team of **Jen Kessy** and **April Ross** guaranteed that they will advance from pool play when they defeated Netherlands' No. 9 Marleen Van Iersel and Sanne Keizer, 21-15, 12-21, 15-8 on Tuesday at the Horse Guards Parade venue. Kessy (San Juan Capistrano, Calif.) and Ross (Costa Mesa, Calif.) are first time Olympians and seeded No. 4 in the tournament. They are now 2-0 in pool play and guaranteed to advance to the first round of single-elimination play.

<u>DID YOU KNOW?</u> At Beijing 2008, the gold medals were won by the USA (men) and Brazil (women).

The U.S. men's beach volleyball team of Phil Dalhausser and Todd Rogers guaranteed they would advance from their Olympic Games pool on Tuesday with a 19-21, 21-16, 15-13 win in 58 minutes over Spain's No. 11 Pablo Herrera Allepuz and Adrián Gavira Collado at the Horse Guards Parade venue. Dalhausser (Ormond Beach, Fla.) and Rogers (Santa Barbara, Calif.) are the defending Olympic champions and seeded No. 2 in the tournament. They are 2-0 in Pool B. Herrera and Gavira are 1-1. Dalhausser and Rogers will go for the pool victory on Thursday, Aug. 2 against No. 14 Petr Benes and Premysl Kubala of Czech Republic.

<u>DID YOU KNOW?</u> The famous set and spike play is thought to have been invented in the Philippines.

 The U.S. men's beach volleyball team of Jake Gibb and Sean Rosenthal ensured it would advance to the next round of the 2012 Olympic Games with a 21-10, 21-16 victory in 37 minutes over Latvia's No. 16 Aleksandrs Samoilovs and Ruslans Sorokins (2-0).

<u>DID YOU KNOW?</u> A five-a-side game similar to volleyball was played in the Middle Ages.

The U.S. Olympic Men's Volleyball Team have won 10 consecutive Olympic Games matches dating back to 2008, but the streak will be put to the test Thursday, Aug. 2, as it plays 2008 Olympic Games silver medalist and No. 1 Brazil at 8 p.m. local time (noon PT) at Earls Court in London.

<u>DID YOU KNOW?</u> The first Olympic Volleyball competition was held in 1964, when the gold medals were won by the Soviet Union (men) and Japan (women).







Kerri Walsh and Misty May-Treanor have never lost an Olympic match, and Monday night, July 31, which was May-Treanor's birthday, was no exception. Though they were out of sync from not having played together since Beijing, when their partnership ended and they ostensibly retired to start a family and focus on teaching, respectively, the duo still managed to beat the Czechs, who held their own, as the finishing scores of the two sets, 21-14 and 21-19, demonstrated.
