CLUB HIGHLIGHT – CLUB STORM OF TAMPA

Each month a member club is featured in **Vol-eNews**. This is a great way to get to know the Club Director(s) and learn more about the clubs throughout Florida. This month **John Babbitt** and **Club Storm of Tampa** will be highlighted.

Q: When did you start your club?

A: 2000

Q: What or who has been most inspiring to you, either personally or professionally?

A: Professionally: Nick Cheronis- I met Nick a couple years ago through PowerCore 360 and I have learned a lot by talking with and listening to him. He is full of ideas and strategies for coaching that have helped me work towards being a better coach. He has an outlook and approach to things that I agree with and can relate to and he composes himself on and off the court in a way that I respect and work to emulate.

Q: Do you have a career outside of coaching? What do you do?

A: Volleyball is my life! Outside of Club Storm, I also run PowerPlay Volleyball through which I run adult grass and indoor tournaments and juniors camps.

Q: What is your most valued item on your desk or in your office? What is its significance?

A: My tablet- it keeps me organized and on track with my daily and long term tasks and goals.

Q: What awards or recognitions have you and/or your club received in the past?

- Former club director Vicky Page was named Club Director of the Year a few years ago
- Dave Wolcott received Male Coach of the Year
- The past few years we also sent more coaches to CAP training than any other club

Q: Do you have any memorable stories with Club Storm?

A: I have a ton of fantastic memories with Club Storm! One of my favorite memories is the first time I heard a former player of mine had gotten a collegiate offer and then going to her “signing” day. This was very rewarding because I had been coaching some of the players on this team since they were 12 and it was great seeing all her hard work pay off.

A more recent memory happened last summer. Club Storm has always been associated and run by the YMCA but as of the past couple years we had outgrown the space they could give us. Last summer we (myself, the coaches, parents and players) all decided it would be best for the club to separate from the Y and become an independent club. We felt this would allow us to grow bigger and stronger and would be best for the future of Club Storm. This undertaking had been by far the most challenging and rewarding experience I have had with Club Storm over the past 10 years.

Q: Tell us about SandStorm. What are your thoughts on the progression of sand volleyball programs offered collegiately in Florida?

A: We started SandStorm last summer to encourage our players to start playing more beach volleyball. We practiced weekly and then our players would attend tournaments on the weekends. I have always loved playing beach and I believe that it is one of the best ways to develop players all around skills. Plus, now that it is a collegiate sport, it is one more avenue for players to pursue playing a scholarship. I think it is awesome that Florida schools are leading the way in building the sport!

Q: What advice could you give to athletes that want to play both indoor and outdoor volleyball in college?

A: Go for it! The two games complement each other and one will make you better at the other. Keep in mind though that playing two sports means a greater commitment. You will be working year round and you will have to work harder than the other athletes in order to maintain your academics. With good time management and a lot of hard work you can do it!

Q: If you could brag about your club, what would you say?

A: Club Storm has always been a club built on the integrity and character of our players and coaches. We work hard to instill character qualities, values and life skills in each of our players and I believe that sets us apart from most other clubs. Character breeds Excellence!

Q: What do you look forward to in the future for the Florida Region?

A: I look forward to bringing a qualifier back to the Florida Region. I also look forward to us continuing to grow beach volleyball and developing well rounded athletes.

Q: What are some awards and recognitions you are most proud of in your volleyball career?

I think that I am most proud of two awards I received my Senior Season at FSU - I was a All American 2nd Team member and I was named the ACC Scholar-Athlete of the year. To be named an All American was an incredible honor and it was the icing on the cake of an absolutely amazing season that I had with my team at FSU. We made it the furthest in the NCAA tournament in school history and I played some of the best volleyball with some of the best girls I

will ever meet. The 2nd recognition that impacted me the most that year was being named my conference's Scholar-Athlete of the year. People think in college as an athlete you only have your sport on your mind, but that it completely not true. As an athlete you are required to maintain good grades to stay eligible, as well as juggle stressful competition schedules thrown right into the middle of your education. For me to have succeeded on and off the court, I was able to complete my college career on the best note possible.

Q: Tell us about your current job.

My current job is a Professional Volleyball Player for the Volleyball Franches-Montagnes Club Team in Saignelegier, Switzerland. If you would have told me when I was younger that I would be a professional volleyball player I may not have believed you. This tall lanky uncoordinated 12 year old girl luckily grew into my 6'3 frame and was able to find passion in volleyball and let the sport take me on the most intense emotional experience I could have asked for.

Q: Who has impacted your volleyball career the most and why?

I would have to say my high school during my sophomore year. I was struggling to fit into a new school and learning how to coordinate my size 15 shoe, 6'3 lanky self - and my coach looked me straight in the eyes and said, "You will be a star Bri". And from that moment on I put my heart, soul, blood, sweat, and tears into volleyball. Not only make my coach proud but to prove to myself that I was strong enough to get through anything.

Q: What advice could you give to junior volleyball athletes on what it takes to be a successful volleyball athlete?

Never give up. and Keep dreaming. Like I said I was not the best athlete when I began to play volleyball but I never let it get me down. I had big dreams when I was young and I was able to push through the obstacles and shine in the great moments and grow to love the sport of volleyball for more than just the sport itself.

Q: What do you look forward to being part of the Team Florida WAVE?

I am looking forward to being back in my home state of Florida. It will be nice to play with teammates from college as well as players I have faced across the net throughout my career. I am excited to try and help push the professional league in the US forward and make the fans realize how exciting volleyball can be.

JR. OFFICIAL'S TRAINING INFO

Officials training took a new turn this year, thanks to a large investment by USA Volleyball in VRT: VolleyballRefTraining.com. This is a comprehensive website for all volleyball referees and scorers. The goals of the website include making training more accessible, standardizing the message and tailoring training to the various user groups, i.e. adult officials, junior officials and player work teams. This year, in addition to the training site, USAV has also invested in a new LMS: Learning Management System. This system offers online testing and tracking for members. Under the new LMS, everyone has a personalized training and testing plan to be sure they are ready for the season. The LMS allows the users to enroll in the courses required for their level of officiating complete the courses and required on line testing, and have their results recorded in the system. Eventually the LMS will link directly with Webpoint, the USAV registration database; so that everyone's learning progress and test scores will be automatically added to their registration record.

So what does this mean for Florida Region players and officials? For clubs training Junior players who must officiate as part of their work team assignments, it means there are more ways to offer training – individual training online, group training by the club, or group training by a region-approved clinician. It means that the message that is delivered is consistent, because the training modules are available to everyone. It also means that training is available on-demand, so even someone who missed a clinic or joins the team late can be trained online. Everyone has the opportunity to learn in the way that is most effective for them – with their laptop or in a classroom, and they can repeat any lesson at any time if needed.

For our adult paid officials we have the opportunity for a consistent training message to be available to each official, with more in-depth and helpful tools like video clips of plays to show the correct calls. The modules are available as a resource for officials who have questions during the season. And all the courses can be monitored to be sure each official has completed all the required training. The New Referee Clinic modules allow us to offer much more comprehensive training to brand new officials, helping them to be better prepared when they take the court for the first time.

With every new system there are challenges, and this has been the case with VRT and LMS. Over 7400 individual learners have registered in the Florida Region this season. We worked through some volume-related delays as many of you accessed the system for the first time in early January. Another common issue was the fact that the LMS required everyone to “create new student” so those who tried to access the system without taking that step experienced some frustration. Other confusion centered on entering the wrong region, enrolling in the wrong courses or not fully completing clinic acknowledgements to access quizzes. Many times these issues were solved by a visit to the Florida Region website under Officials and Junior Work Team Training. (<http://www.floridavolleyball.org/junior-work-team-information.html>) The click-by-click instructions there were helpful to many users.

What's next for VRT and LMS? The site has been moved over to a new, USAV-owned server for better performance and functionality. You will notice that the background screens are now red instead of blue on the new server. Also now that we have tracking information for all users, we are able to identify those who have or have not completed training requirements. If there are issues at tournaments where a work team is not able to perform their duties properly, we can review the training records and alert the club director, allowing the club to address and correct the situation before any formal disciplinary action is needed.

This new training system is a great resource for all of us. Whether an adult or a junior player, when an official is well trained and confident they are able to do a better job for the teams. The best officials are those who go through the entire match virtually unnoticed. Going forward, VRT and LMS will help all Florida Region officials and players move toward becoming well-trained, confident and "unnoticed" in their matches, keeping all the focus where it belongs: on the teams competing in the match.
