CLUB HIGHLIGHT – FLORIDA GOLD COAST VOLLEYBALL CLUB

Each month we will be featuring a member club in *Vol-eNews*. This is a great way to get to know the Club Director(s) and learn more about the club. We will be highlighting clubs of all sizes and disciplines in future editions of *Vol-eNews*.

The first club we are highlighting is **Florida Gold Coast Volleyball Club**, located in Boca Raton. They have been around since 1986, which makes

them one of the oldest clubs in Florida. They have a very successful club and a dedicated, hard-working, and skilled Club



Director, **Lori Eaton**. She is also a newly appointed Jr. Admin Board Representative for the junior clubs in our Region and was recently inducted into the Florida Region Hall of Fame. We interviewed Lori and asked her some questions to find out more about her and her club. Enjoy as you learn more about **Lori Eaton** and the **Florida Gold Coast Volleyball Club**.

Q: Lori, how old were you when you started playing volleyball?

A: I started in elementary with a P.E. teacher who developed a competitive circuit and then in high school but my passion at the time was softball.

Q: What position did you play in college?

A: I was recruited to Colgate University to play volleyball, start a softball program, and basketball. I played right side my freshman year, middle my sophomore year and outside my junior and senior years.

Q: Was it after college you realized you wanted to coach volleyball instead of softball?

A: My college coach (**Janet Little** who is the associate A.D. and in charge of intramurals now at Colgate University where I went) had a great way of making us want to win while appreciating the technical aspects of the game. I developed a passion for learning the why's and how-to's of the game because of her. After college, I moved to Buffalo and assisted **Kelly Andrews** (now at Univ. of Toledo as associate A.D.) at Erie Community College where we were ranked in the top 16 in the nation which suggested to me we were a good team and I loved it.

Q: Who is your favorite NCAA D1 volleyball school?

A: I really like Stanford because over the years I have seen many of their player's since they were 14's at various Junior Olympics. I also think Stanford is a tough academic school.



Q: Did any girls from your club team move on to play for Stanford?

A: Unfortunately, I did not have any girls go to Stanford but I have had some go to UCLA, Rice, N. Alabama, Florida State, Texas, Colgate, Buffalo, Valdosta, Nova, and every kind of school in between.

Q: How long have you been coaching volleyball?

A: I started coaching when I was interning in Hamilton, N.Y. back in 1980.

Q: What was your biggest challenge you faced coaching college girls your first couple of years?

A: In Hamilton, I coached high school but when I coached at Erie, it was the 2 year athlete that I had the biggest problem with because you only had them for 2 years. It seemed like as you got them to the level you wanted, you lost them to a 4 year school. I actually was "burned out" from the pressure of being ranked and maintaining that as well as the weather in Buffalo which is why I moved. On my way down here, I was called by Yale University to coach volleyball and softball but chose the sunny skies of Florida instead!! Once I applied for jobs, it just so happened that the coach for Spanish River was leaving and so was **Steve George** so I fit right in.

Q: When did you start your club team?

A: Gold Coast was originally started by **Steve George** who left the year I moved down to Florida so I took it over in 1986.

Q: What is your opinion on the growth of volleyball throughout the years?

A: Volleyball has grown in numbers without a doubt but some of the finesse of the game has been changed by the rule changes which I do not like all of them.

Q: Do you think the growth has helped volleyball with media coverage? How?

A: I think the biggest contributor to the growth of volleyball was the winning of the medals at the Olympics. I see increases after USA wins and especially since **Kerry Walsh** and **Misty May** have come onto the scene. The media loves the two of them because they are good athletes, pretty, and good role models.

Q: What are some of your club's accomplishments? (Ex. All-State, All-Americans, College scholarships, etc.)

A: We have had All Americans, scholarships, and many success stories of which I could go on forever but the most memorable would have to be my 1996 Spanish



River team that was tied for first of all high schools and in combination with Olympic heights players won the Crossroads and was about to win the Junior Olymics when they were 16 but one of our player went down with an ACL injury.

Q: Do you recall any memorable stories with Gold Coast Volleyball?

A: I have a lot of wonderful memories with club; meeting coaches from other states to seeing my past player's children. I would not change anything I did for the past 22 years with Gold Coast.

Q: You are one of Florida's first volleyball clubs, with that being said, what have you done to continue your success as a coach?

A: I think Gold Coast has appealed to the player who likes to play in general. We have also kept our club costs down. We have not enjoyed the successes we have had in the past but I think a lot of that has to do with the number of clubs increasing and "watering down" the power that can be achieved in one club.

Q: Does your club do anything to promote youth volleyball (11 and under)?

We are in the process of working with the local YMCA to promote youth volleyball in our area.

JUNIOR CLUB TRYOUTS

This year USA Volleyball has changed the membership season start date. The new membership season is now September 1st through August 31st. This new date will also coincide with the age definitions the National Office sets for players. Girls Jr. Clubs were allowed to have a tryout prior to the start of the high school season on August 22nd, 23rd, 29th or 30th. Those were the only dates tryouts were allowed to be held for any rostered FHSAA player until the high school season ends. Tryouts for FHSAA players will begin again on or after November 22nd. With these new dates players may commit to a club as early as September 1st or anytime thereafter.

Clubs are allowed to hold positional training camps/clinics and private lessons on Sundays during the FHSAA season. Clubs are **not** allowed to have a mandatory practice or open gym during the FHSAA high school season as many of the players are already participating with their high school teams. All players that attend any sanctioned USAV event must be registered with USAV in order to participate in the event. IMPACT & CAP CLINIC

IMPACT (Improved Mastery and Practical Application of Coaching Theory) is an entry-level coaching requirement of USA Volleyball. Individuals who wish to enter into coaching must complete the IMPACT entry-level instruction before the start of the season in the Region in which they reside.

CAP (Coaching Accreditation Program) is the next level after IMPACT for volleyball coaches. The CAP certification is offered in 4 levels with level 4 being a Master Coach.
