The 2010 high school volleyball season has come to an end and the FHSAA State Volleyball champions have been crowned. You will find a list of the winning teams and their coaches on page 6 of this edition and also on the Home Page of our Florida Region website. Congratulations to all of the high school teams and coaches that competed in the state championship tournament!

On the college scene we continue to see many of our Florida colleges having great success in the post-season. Here is a highlight on a few of them:

- Pasco-Hernando Community College (**Kim Whitney**) won the NJCAA DII National Volleyball Championship title! This is a first for PHCC.
- Clearwater Christian College (**Dr. Vickie Denny**) has won the NCCAA DII National Volleyball Championship title for the 5<sup>th</sup> year in a row!
- University of Florida (**Mary Wise**) is heading into the NCAA DI National Volleyball Championship tournament ranked #1. (The Gators will play in Gainesville on Dec 3<sup>rd</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup>)
- University of Tampa (**Chris Catanach**) has made it to the Elite 8 of the NCAA DII National Volleyball Championship tournament and will play on Dec 2<sup>nd</sup> in Louisville, KY for a chance to make it to the Final Four.
- Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University (**Joslynn Gallop**) has made it to the NAIA National Volleyball Championship tournament in Sioux City, Iowa. They play on Nov 30<sup>th</sup>, Dec 1<sup>st</sup>, & Dec 2<sup>nd</sup> in Pool A of the tournament.
- Florida State University (**Chris Poole**) and University of Miami (**Nicole Lantagne Welch**) have also made it to the NCAA DI National Volleyball Championship Tournament.
- Miami Dade College (**Kiko Benoit**) finished in 6<sup>th</sup> place at the NJCAA DI National Volleyball Championship tournament in West Plains, MO.

As college volleyball winds down this month, we will continue to make preparations for the 2010/2011 club volleyball season.

## CLUB HIGHLIGHT – VOLLEYBALL INSTITUTE OF PALM BEACH

Each month a member club is featured in *Vol-eNews*. This is a great way to get to know the Club Director(s) and learn more about the clubs throughout Florida. This month **Shanon Lewis** and **Volleyball Institute of Palm Beach** will be highlighted.



### **Q: What would you consider to be your biggest accomplishments with volleyball?**

**A:** I used to think it was all the awards, the scholarship to Louisville, but that all changed this past year. We had a young lady on our 18 and under team, who had never played club volleyball before; she was far behind in the basic skills needed to perform at the next level. She did not have a supportive parental system, in regards to playing volleyball, but she wanted to play in college like no other player I had ever seen. She had gotten a job so she could pay her team fees herself and we worked with her on her skills and helped her with the recruiting process. She went to a tournament that had a showcase prior to the start of competition and a coach saw her athletic ability and inquired about her. This player ended up getting a full ride to a DII school. When she called to let me know that she had signed and to thank us for helping achieve her goal, it was the first time I felt like we (VIP) had really helped someone who loves the game of volleyball as much as I do.

### **Q: Tell us how you got started in volleyball?**

**A:** 1984 was the summer between my 8<sup>th</sup> and freshman year in High School. It was also a summer Olympic year and the USA men's volleyball team won gold and our USA women's team took silver. I had been playing varsity volleyball already, but the Olympics put a whole new perspective and increased my passion for getting better and possibly playing in the Olympics one day. I was glued to TV and having to set my alarm and get up and watch at 3:00am. My life changed after the 1984 Olympics! I wanted to pass like Karch Kiraly and jump like Rita the Rocket – Crockett. I begged my parents to go to all the volleyball camps I could go to, IPFW and Arnie Balls camps, and Ball State camps. After my high school season was over my dad found an advertisement in the Fort Wayne paper and it was one line – Do you want to play volleyball in college? Call this number 219..... . We called and went to a meeting at IPFW and the rest is history. The club director Randy Litchfield had just graduated from Ball State where he was the setter for the men's team and had returned back to Fort Wayne to start a club. I remember him telling all of us that he had blown out his knee trying out for the 1984 Olympic team and I remember telling my dad that whatever it took to do what he did I wanted to do it too, just minus the busted knee.



**Q: Tell us about your playing and coaching experiences in college?**

**A:** I played at the University of Louisville in Kentucky and I was the assistant women's and head men's coach at Tri-State University in Indiana.

**Q: What is one thing you took away from coaching at the collegiate level?**

**A:** Contacts, lots and lots of contacts, and I learned a lot in regards to creating a team that works together towards a common goal. In club and high school, you really don't have the choices in regard to the team dynamic as you do when you coach and recruit for college. I also had the privilege to be at a university with both men's and women's volleyball programs, so the interaction between the two is also something that provides a completely different dynamic to the programs.

**Q: What do you like to do when you are not coaching?**

**A:** I like snorkeling, reading and traveling, although, since starting a beach program, snorkeling and traveling has kind of been put on the backburner.

**Q: Tell us about your beach program.**

**A:** Living on a farm in Indiana did not give me many opportunities to play beach volleyball while I was growing up. Although we had 101 lakes in our county, none of them had a sandy beach with a beach volleyball net. I grew up in a gym, playing volleyball with socks and shoes. I played in a couple tournaments in Mishawaka and up and down the Michigan side of Lake Michigan summers between college and afterwards, but I was not a big fan of the sand. Being of Irish decent, I get overheated and was unable to perform to my satisfaction. I got 2<sup>nd</sup> in a couple tournaments but I always felt like I was playing in mud. Give me a hard court and shoes!

Last year, when we were just talking about forming VIP, my partner, Dave Saenz, who is from California and grew up playing on the beach, brought up the beach opportunities in Florida. We discussed the pros and cons of starting a beach program and the pros outweighed the cons and we went for it and it was spectacular! Our first tournament saw one of our 16 and under teams in finals of the club division. Our boys and girls got better each week and continued to get medals and the season highlight was our 14 and under girls' team winning the National Championship.

**Q: What is Sitting Volleyball?**

**A:** Sitting volleyball is a Paralympics sport that provides a volleyball opportunity to disabled athletes, as well as, another training tool for able bodied athletes. VIP has been working with USA Paralympics Volleyball staff to start a men's and women's team in South Florida, in hopes that other clubs in the Florida Region will do so as well. We are working with the local VA and other organizations regarding getting the word out, as well as sponsoring our athletes to attend a couple of local tournaments. We hope that we can provide some kind of athletic outlet to our injured men and women who have come back from Iraq or Pakistan with injuries. If anyone is interested in starting a

league, or knows of someone who is disabled and may want to play in their area, they can contact me at 954-304-6630.

**Q: If you could brag about your club, what would you say?**

**A:** I would brag about the staff, parents and players that have chosen to be a part of the VIP family. We really have a great bunch of people involved with our program.

**Q: What future plans do you have for your club?**

**A:** We have already expanded with our sister club, VIP 127, which is in Michigan. But really we just look to provide our customers with a quality product in the hopes that the players will continue to play and love volleyball throughout their lifetime and maybe even give back to the sport by becoming a coach or an official.

**Q: What do you look forward to in the future for the Florida Region?**

**A:** The continued growth of the sport. The more people we introduce to this wonderful game, the better!

## FLORIDA COLLEGIATE VOLLEYBALL LEAGUE (FCVL)



The Florida Collegiate Volleyball League (FCVL) was formed to create more opportunities for men to play Club Volleyball at the collegiate level and eventually transition to being a scholarship sport in Florida. The FCVL is a member league of the National Collegiate Volleyball Federation (NCVF) and offers men's and women's college club volleyball competition for any 2 year and 4 year colleges located within the boundaries of the league.

Teams will compete in Conference play during the months of October, November, December, January, & February. The Conference Championships and League Championships will take place in March. The NCVF National Championships will take place in April.

Florida has 38 colleges that are eligible to participate in the FCVL. So far, the FCVL has signed on 9 clubs to participate.
